# SHELTERING FAMILIES AT RISK OF SEPARATION

32 Families

FT grew emergency family shelter capacity by winning grant funding for 15 rented motel rooms, which combined with six FT-owned shelter units to triple our shelter capacity.



#### **BRIDGING THE GAP**

19 Families

The FT property portfolio of Bridge Housing, Transitional Housing, and Affordable Permanent Rental Housing expanded in response to our community's loss of housing that extremely low-income families can afford.



### REHOUSING FAMILIES

29 Families

Housing navigation services and rental/utilities assistance helped families move from area shelters to permanent housing with leases in their own names.



# TRANSITIONING FAMILIES TO HOUSING

76% Housed

Despite the growing housing crisis, 3 out of 4 families that were enrolled for Rapid Rehousing support obtained permanent housing.



# ACHIEVING LONG-TERM HOUSING SUCCESS

81% Success Rate

Housing stabilization support for up to a year helped the vast majority achieve successful housing outcomes.

### **GROWING CAPACITY**

In 2022, Wake County awarded FT over \$1 million to help move as many people as possible to permanent housing. The funding enabled FT to enhance and expand services by adding five new staff positions to our Housing and Family Services team. The funding also covers the cost of 15 motel rooms for our emergency shelter program, as well as transportation, childcare and more to help families overcome mounting challenges and achieve long-term housing success.

### **EVOLVING AND ENDURING**

Families Together staff and board completed a strategic planning process in 2022 assessing the rapidly changing landscape in which we operate. We used this assessment to develop new long-range strategic objectives to guide our organizational development into the future. The new strategy builds on the enduring legacy of our Lutheran church partners, the incredible support of our growing community of individuals and partners and the vital work necessary to make our community better for all.

Our vision and mission were updated to better reflect the Families Together organization of today:

**Vision:** Our community free of homelessness, with families thriving together.

Mission: Through direct support and advocacy, we assist families with children as they transition from homelessness to sustainable housing and stable homes.


# FAMILY STORY: MULTI-GENERATIONAL IMPACT

Several years ago, Ms. S. came to Families Together when she and her two children experienced homelessness. Our team helped her find a home and provided ongoing holistic wraparound support.

With a stable roof overhead, her daughter began to thrive in school and became the valedictorian of her pre-K class. Partly inspired by her daughter, Ms. S. got busy and enrolled at a local university. In the spring of 2022, she graduated, and, in the fall, she accepted a professional position in her field and began graduate school.


